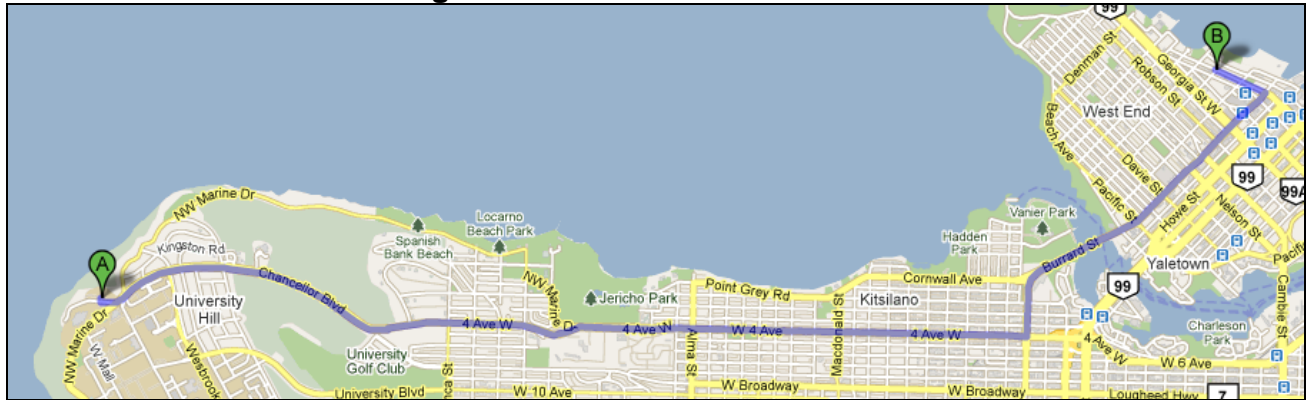

## Directions from Green College to Cruise



### Start at: Green College, University of British Columbia Canada

1. Head south toward Cecil Green Park Rd 28 m
2. Turn left at Cecil Green Park Rd 140 m
3. Turn left at NW Marine Dr 62 m
4. Continue onto Chanceller Blvd E 2.5 km
5. Continue onto 4 Ave W 5.6 km
6. Turn left at Burrard St 450 m
7. Slight right to stay on Burrard St 2.7 km
8. Turn left at W Hastings St 450 m  
W Hastings St

There is a public parking at the intersection of Hasting and Bute (see map) or if you are lucky, you may find free parking around the boat departure.
